Susan Daywitt Offers Advice to Afghan and Rwandan Businesswomen

SLM Facility Solutions Nationwide CEO Participates in International Teaching Summit

DALLAS – JUNE 10, 2010 – Susan Daywitt was invited to meet with Afghan and Rwandan female business owners to share business advice and offer guidance. Held at Northwood University in Dallas, this conference was sponsored by the PEACE THROUGH BUSINESS organization.

Daywitt taught a class on storyboarding designed to help the participants implement a business plan. Daywitt addressed international and domestic problems, as well as helping with direct marketing needs.

Daywitt says that that the same problems we face domestically are felt by young women entrepreneurs around the world. "To see the enthusiasm and feel the energy in the room is inspiring," Daywitt remarks, "At a time when world economic news seems to paint a gloomy picture, I was really impressed with the commitment and positive attitude of these students throughout the entire conference."
